# CICM PRESENTS RESPONSIBLE CARE MANAGEMENT SYSTEM (RCMS) CERTIFICATION TO UNIVERSITI SAINS MALAYSIA (USM)

**USM Penang, December 17, 2025** – The Chemical Industries Council of Malaysia (CICM) presented the Responsible Care Management System (RCMS) certification to Universiti Sains Malaysia (USM), in recognition of USM's successful completion of the RCMS Implementation Programme for Institution of Higher Learning (IHL).

The certification was formally presented by the CICM Deputy Chairman, Mr Paul R Ellis, to USM Vice Chancellor, Professor Dato' Seri Ir. Dr. Abdul Rahman Mohamed, during a ceremony held this afternoon at the Main Campus of the Institute of Research in Molecular Medicine (INFORMM) in USM.

USM's achievement follows a journey that began with the signing of an MoU between CICM and USM in August 2024, with CICM providing the support and guidance to USM for their RCMS implementation. A total of four (4) sites i.e. the School of Chemical Engineering, School of Chemical Sciences, the Institute of Research in Molecular Medicine (INFORMM) - Main Campus and INFORMM - Health Campus participated in the programme. The implementation focused on four (4) codes of the Responsible Care (RC) Codes of Management Practices, i.e. Employee Health & Safety Code, Environmental Protection Code, Community Awareness & Emergency Response Code and Process Safety Code (specific to the School of Chemical Engineering). The programme concluded in October 2025 with all 4 sites meeting the certification requirements.

"USM is the first institution of higher learning in Malaysia that has come onboard and pledged their commitment to the Responsible Care initiative in Malaysia. This certification reflects USM's dedication in advancing its health, safety, environment and security (HSES) practices, also setting a benchmark for more IHLs to adopt Responsible Care. Their achievement also marks a significant step in aligning academia with industry standards for HSES governance" said Mr Paul R Ellis, CICM Deputy Chairman.

While RCMS is tailored for the chemical industry in general, CICM introduced the RCMS Implementation Programme for Institutions of Higher Learning (IHL) to broaden awareness and encourage adoption of Responsible Care principles within the academia. This programme was carried out with the support from the Social Security Organization (SOCSO) and also the International Council of Chemical Associations (ICCA).

Responsible Care is a voluntary initiative of the global chemical industry, initiated by Canada in 1984 and has since been promoted by national chemical associations in nearly 70 economies worldwide. The aim is to drive continuous improvement in safe chemicals management and achieve excellence in health, safety, environment and security (HSES) performance.

In Malaysia, CICM is the main steward of Responsible Care since 1994. Today, 150 chemical companies in the country have pledged to manage their operations according to the Guiding Principles and Codes of Management Practices of Responsible Care.
